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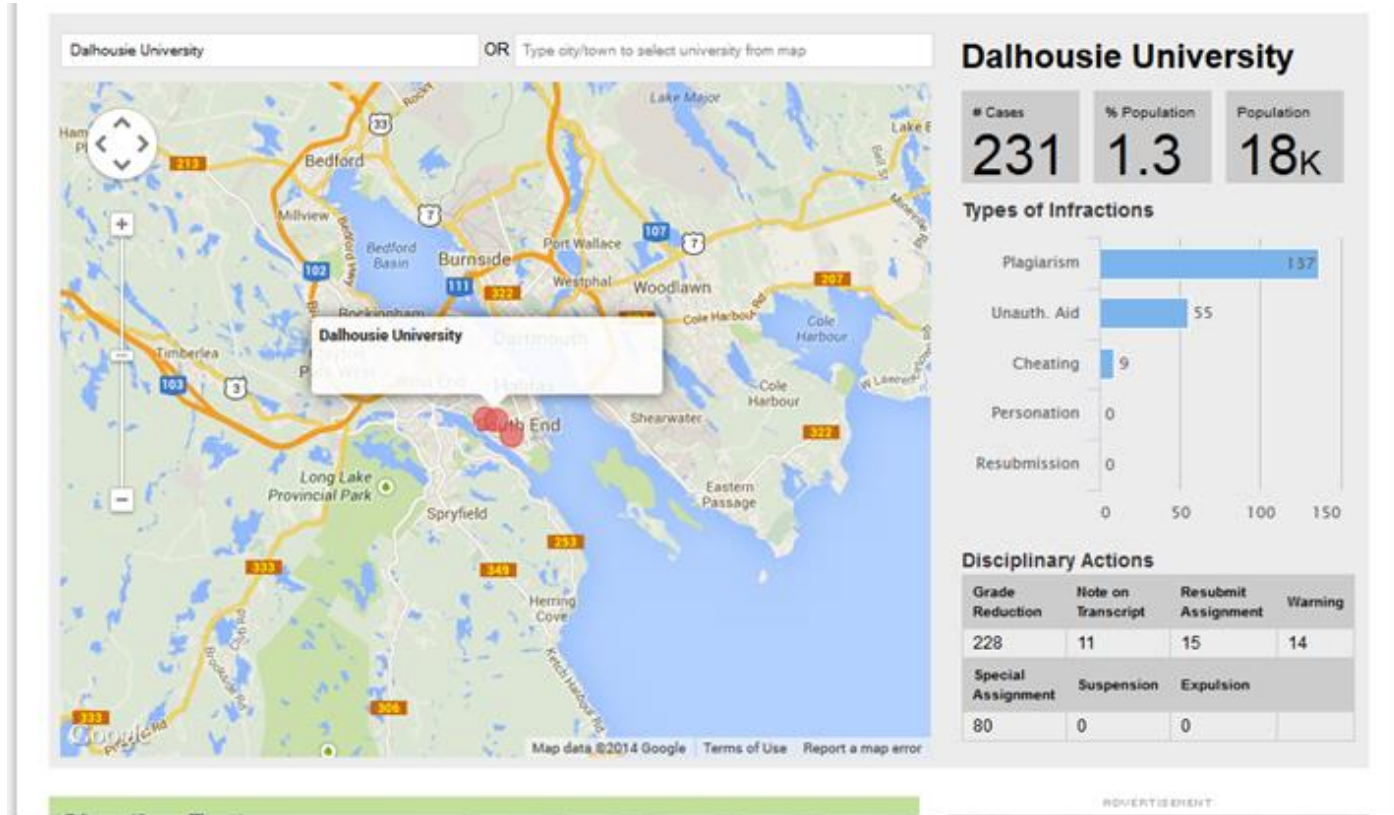

Plagiarism in Universities

- At U of T, the number of official cases of plagiarism climbed to 403 in 2005-06 from 92 a decade ago.
- 698 students on 9 campuses were surveyed by Scanlon and Neumann in 2002 and 24.5 % were found to be plagiarizing through cutting and pasting from an Internet source (Scanlon, 2003)
- A data from 2, 200 students across 21 campuses reveals 10% copying a few sentences from web sources and 5% turned papers in with major parts copied from web sources (McCabe, 2001).
- A CBC survey of Canadian universities shows more than 7,000 students were disciplined for academic cheating in 2011-12

 - ▶ Plug-ins to generate in-text citations
- [Refworks](#), [Zotero](#), [Google Scholar](#)
 - ▶ Helpful for those who plagiarize out of lack of familiarity with citation styles, lack of organization, or time management.



Preventing plagiarism: “versioning”

● Get to know your students’ writing:

- ▶ Collect writing samples early in the course: submit digitally, or a timed Blackboard assessment
- ▶ Use Blackboard to manage versions, drafts and attempts
- ▶ Assignment → Availability
- ▶ Students can submit sources: easy to attach



Detection

- **Safe Assign**
- **Turnitin.com** (Thousands of institutions in more than 100 countries, including 45 colleges and universities in Canada, now use turnitin.com.)
- **Other on-line plagiarism detectors: Paperrater, Grammarly, Google, etc.**
- **Readability-Score to compare versions**
 - ▶ If a student suddenly seems to have improved a lot overnight
- **In-class demos could help prevent plagiarism by those who copy because of “lack of deterrence” (Park, 2003)**

Improving Student Writing: Our context

● ESL Programs:

- ▶ Intensive, full-time pre-sessional training in EAP (English for Academic Purposes) for students conditionally admitted to Dalhousie (and other universities)
- ▶ In the curriculum: developing academic writing skills, using and incorporating sources
- ▶ Much plagiarism occurs accidentally due to weak writing skills
- ▶ We deal with both detecting and preventing plagiarism through skills development

Activity: Find the Plagiarism

- **Distribute a paragraph that contains a combination of original writing and plagiarized/incorrectly attributed material.**
- **Springboard for discussion: as to how to cite correctly, writer's voice, etc.**
- **Also acts as a deterrent**

Safe Assign as a Teaching Tool

- Assessment → SafeAssignment in Blackboard
- Very important: check DRAFT
- Students can view SafeAssign report

Text Summarizers and Article Rewriters

- **Text Summarizers:** [TextCompacter](#), [Autosummarizer](#), etc.
 - ▶ These sites identify keywords in a text, and reduce the text to a given percentage of its original length.
- **Article re-writers:** [SmallSEOTools](#), [EZRewrite](#)
 - ▶ These sites find words in a text that can be replaced with synonyms, and slot them in.

- ▶ How do you paraphrase: are synonyms enough?
- ▶ Do the article re-writes sound natural?
