We are pleased to announce **Dr. Mikiko Terashima** as the Acting Dean, Architecture and Planning, commencing March 24, 2025. Dr. Terashima will serve in this role for the next year while Dr. Graham Gagnon is in the Acting Vice-President, Research and Innovation role.

Dr. Terashima joined the Faculty of Architecture and Planning in 2014. Trained as an urban planner (MSc in Planning, UBC, 2000) and socio-spatial epidemiologist (Interdisciplinary PhD, Dalhousie University, 2011), Dr. Terashima's research activities aim to advance research and practice to make built environments healthier, equitable, and inclusive for all.

She currently runs the Planning for Equity, Accessibility, and Community Health (PEACH) Research Unit, located in the School of Planning. Dr. Terashima has served as Associate Dean of Research and Global Relations for the Faculty since January 2023, and she is looking forward to contributing as Acting Dean to support faculty, students, and staff in continued success and growth.
