Dalhousie University is beginning a thorough and comprehensive search to identify and appoint the next Campus Principal and Dean, Faculty of Agriculture. We have retained the search firm <u>KBRS</u> to assist us, with Katherine Frank, Partner serving as the lead consultant on the assignment.

We are in the process of appointing a search committee and have begun a consultation process to gather feedback and input from key members of the university community to help inform the Search Committee's discussions and their understanding of the ideal candidate profile and position mandate.
