

Transparency Statement for the Nomination of a SSHRC Tier 2 Canada Research Chair

Dalhousie University intends to apply the emergency retention mechanism to nominate an existing faculty member for a SSHRC Tier 2 Canada Research Chair.

The allocation of this Canada Research Chair supports Dalhousie's Research and Innovation Strategic Direction, and is directly aligned with the Signature Research Cluster "Culture, Society, Community Development". The nominee is an outstanding researcher who has made exceptional research, teaching and administrative contributions to the Department, Faculty and University. The nominee is considered an emerging leader in the field and, as such, has received an offer for employment from another institution. Loss of this researcher would have a significant negative impact on the Dalhousie community.
