TRANSFER CREDITS: Students who may be eligible for course credits based on IB/AP courses should ensure their final official transcripts are forwarded to Dalhousie **as soon as they become available**.

Students joining Dalhousie after having attended another post-secondary institution should connect with an **academic advisor** to discuss changes to the above course plan, depending on anticipated transfer courses because of previous study. This includes exchange students joining Dalhousie from Ares University of Applied Sciences.

Students must **request** that their previous study be assessed if they are looking to transfer credits from another institution, including IB/AP courses. Details regarding this process are available online at dal.ca/transfercredits.

Students attending Dalhousie from Ares University of Applied Sciences do **not** need to request transfer credit assessment.
