FUTURE STUDIES: Graduates of the diploma program may continue their studies for two years to earn either the Bachelor of Landscape Architecture or Bachelor of Technology Small Business Management degree. Students considering either pathway should meet with an advisor to discuss their degree plans.

TRANSFER CREDITS: Students who may be eligible for course credits based on IB/AP courses should ensure their final official transcripts are forwarded to Dalhousie **as soon as they become available**.

Students joining Dalhousie after having attended another post-secondary institution should connect with an **academic advisor** to discuss changes to the above course plan, depending on anticipated transfer courses because of previous study. Students must **request** that their previous study be assessed if they are looking to transfer credits from another institution, including IB/AP courses.
